Pastor: Unknown

Purpose: To defeat Judaism (the practice of making people who are saved keep the law as well)

Location: South Galatia & included the cities of Derbe, Lystra, Iconium & Antioch of Pisidian.

Facts:

- 1) Called the Cornerstone of the Protestant Reformation
- 2) Established a church on his 2<sup>nd</sup> missionary journey (Acts 16:6-8)
- 3) Key is Freedom from the Law
