Joel –Name means “The Lord is God”

Probably a Ruebenite with Judean roots

Father was Pethuel

Very little other information is known about him

The Book

Date – Scholars are divided into three camps

- Early Pre-exilic
- Late Pre-exilic
- Post-exilic

It has 73 verses

Favorite phrase – “The day of the Lord” [Used 5 times]

Ministered to the southern kingdom

Has many prophetic statements
