The Man

- Jonah means “Dove”
- From Gath-hepher – According to II Kings 14:25 located 3-4 miles from Nazereth

Jonah could not grieve over sin as God does and Jonah could not rejoice over repentance as God does.

The Ministry

Contemporary of King Jeroboam II 790-750 BC

His whole message is 8 words (half of a verse)

The only prophet to run from God.

Ministered in the Northern Kingdom

Prophesied in II Kings 14:25

The Book

Theme – God’s concern for the lost

- First two chapters - saves a sinner
- Last two chapters – saves a city

7 times in the book God spoke: “the Word of the Lord came”

Jesus affirmed the book – Matt 12:40; Luke 11:30
