Background Information

The Man

His name means “Jehovah hides”

Hezekiah the king was his great, great grandfather

He probably lived in Jerusalem

He is the only prophet of royal descent and high social standing.

He was a contemporary of Jeremiah

He prophesied during Josiah’s reign.

The Message

Key Phrase: “The Day of the LORD”

1. The key to understanding this phrase is found in the book
2. This phrase is used more in this book than any other Old Testament Book.
3. There are two parts to “the day of the Lord.”
 - Judgment
 - Restoration
4. Definition: A divine interruption of or intrusion into human affairs for the purpose of bringing about purification and maintaining a realization of God’s sovereignty.

Date: Between 622 – 612 BC

(Sometime during Josiah’s [640-609 BC] reign but it seems his revival has/is taking place.

Revival when discovering the scroll was 622 BC) For the condition of Judah read II Kings 23:5-25

Tribulation, Armageddon, and millennial kingdom are all mentioned.

The destruction of Nineveh is predicted in 2:13.
