Background Information

The Book of Romans was written by the Apostle Paul to the believers at Rome sometime between 55-58 AD. It was probably written from Corinth. Its purpose is to show that man can not earn salvation no matter what he is or could be. It lays out God's plan of salvation for everyone. The key verse is Romans 6:23. The latter part of the book lays out the way a person who is saved should behave. The key verse in this section is Romans 12:1-2.
